ORDINANCE NO. 15 OF 2015

AN ORDINANCE OF CLARKS SUMMIT BOROUGH AMENDING THE ESTABLISHED PARKING RATES.

Clarks Summit Borough Council hereby ordains:

Section 1. Parking Meter Zones Amended. From now and into the future, the Borough Council for Clarks Summit Borough shall set the fee for parking at a parking meter in the Borough of Clarks Summit by resolution ~~Fee set by Ordinance~~.


Section 2. Repealer. Any Resolution, Ordinance or part of any Ordinance or Resolution inconsistent herewith and any amendments thereof are hereby expressly repealed insofar as they affect this Ordinance.

Section 3. Severability. If any section, clause, provision or portion of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect any other section, clause, provision or portion of this Ordinance so long as it remains legally enforceable minus the invalid portion. The Borough reserves the right to amend this Ordinance or any portion thereof from time to time as it shall deem advisable in the best interests of the promotion of the purposes and intent of this Resolution and the effective administration thereof.


Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage.


Section 5. Authority. This Ordinance is enacted by the Council of the Borough of Clarks Summit under the authority of the Act of Legislature, February 1, 1966, P.L. (1965) No. 581 Section 1005, as amended 1979, November 2, P.L. 458 No. 94, 53 P.S. Section 46005, et seq., known as the Borough Code and any other applicable law arising under the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
