3. OPENING OF BIDS:

2022 Paving: Ms. Kehoe opened bids for paving. The lowest bid will be sent to the engineer to make sure all the specs are met. Lowest bid is from Pensy.

2002 Sterling: Ms. Kehoe stated that the winning bid is \$20,100.

1995 Lawn Tractor: Ms. Kehoe stated that the winning bid is \$650.

Next week Council needs ratify numbers then she can reward the bids.

- **CDBG Projects:** Ms. Kehoe stated that by June 24th, the county needs information as to the decision made by Council for a project.
- **2022-01 - Noise Ordinance:** Solicitor Hayes presented the ordinance with changes. Bob Sheils also had input on the ordinance and the changes he deemed appropriate.
- **Burn Ordinance:** There have been complaints concerning burning in the borough. Ms. Kehoe sent council a number of sample ordinances. This can be voted on next week.
- **Puthusseril request:** Asking signage on Summit Hill on Knapp Road due to the traffic.
- **Matkosky request:** Burning issue concern.
- **Tessa Bennish request:** House on Grandview and Knapp, wooded lot on the left. She was concerned about the trees, and she asked if someone could help possible clean up the area. This is not the homeowner, but it is a neighbor of hers.
- **PT police request:** Police would like to hire a part timer. Next meeting, Council can vote.

- Parking on Thurston: The DPW is having issues with plows and large trucks not able to get through. The engineer reviewed the situation. There is a recommendation to have no parking on a part of that street.
